CSS Styles – Group Project

Directions:

You and your web development team will design the website for the next “BIG” thing. You will build your website using standard HTML5 syntax, but all formatting and styles for your webpage must come from CSS.

DO NOT USE <i> OR TAGS TO FORMAT TEXT, AND DO NOT USE TABLES TO LAY OUT ELEMENTS!

Your website must contain the following:

- An index.html page that serves as the introduction to your website and its topic
- At least three (3) sub-pages that provide additional details regarding the topic of your website
- A “Works Cited” page containing references to where you got your information
- An external style-sheet that provides at least some styles to all of your pages
- One (1) main folder that contains all of your HTML files
- Two (2) separate sub-folders: one for images, one for your css file(s)
- A logical means of navigating your website (i.e. all pages are accessible)

Feel free to choose from the following topics, or pick one of your own (with teacher approval):

- A website promoting a new product or a new service (i.e. iPhone or Uber)
- A biographical website (can be based of factual person or fictional character)
- An informational website describing a process (real or imagined)

NOTE: Your code will be loaded to a live web server, so be sure to avoid static links (especially those starting with H:\).

Grading Criteria

When completed, your teacher will direct you to the location for you to turn in the code for grading.

Your code will be evaluated using the following criteria, however, this is the BARE MINIMUM, and you should always try to achieve more!

- _____ Website contains an Index page and a Works Cited page [1 point]
- _____ Website contains at least 3 sub-pages with detailed information [1 point]
- _____ Website has 2 sub-folders containing images and CSS files [1 point]
- _____ Uses class definitions (or IDs) to control appearance [1 point]
- _____ Uses Box Model borders and shading [1 point]
- _____ Uses margins and/or padding to control space [1 point]
- _____ Uses different font families for different sections [1 point]
- _____ Uses different font colors for different sections [1 point]
- _____ Overrides text styling to create bold and underline effects [1 point]
- _____ At least one (1) element remains fixed in place if the user scrolls webpage [1 point]
- _____ Text wraps around at least one (1) image [1 point]
- _____ Backgrounds must be used for at least one (1) element in the web page [1 point]
